By the Dean:

Stand Still in Jordan

Most of us are tired of the rain. Flooding has become a common occurrence in our area. Recently, my wife was driving down a rural road. She turned a corner and was halted by floodwaters flowing across the road. Wisely, she heeded the saying, "turn around, don't drown".

Having also personally experienced this situation, I know what it is like to stand in frustration and wonder what to do. Should I forge ahead, and risk being swept away? Is the risk worth the reward? Sometimes, life situations are like a flooded roadway. The desired objective is on the other side of an obstruction.

After Moses died, Joshua began leading God's people. Joshua was the man God chose to lead His people into the promised land. However, between Israel and God's promise for them, was the Jordan River. God could have easily dried up the river (remember Moses and the Red Sea). But instead of drying up the river bed before anyone started walking across, God did something different. Joshua recorded, "And thou shalt command the priests that bear the ark of the covenant, saying, When ye are come to the brink of the water of Jordan, ye shall stand still in Jordan" (Joshua 3:8).

Everyone wants the Lord to completely eliminate obstacles and guide their lives down a freshly mown trail without hindrances. But life is rarely this smooth. Usually, life's path is full of more dangers and potholes than a Louisiana roadway.

So, what is a person to do when facing an obstacle? Should he patiently stand until the Lord removes every barrier and illuminates the "welcome" sign? Should he turn and run another direction, fleeing any hint of a challenge? Certainly, no blanket answer can be given which is applicable to all situations, but, I do want to offer another possibility, get your toes wet.

Obviously, the challenges of discussion are not sinful. The Bible clearly teaches God's people to steer clear of even the hint of sin, but, nowhere does the Word teach God's people to run from everything. Maybe a slight testing is warranted to discover whether or not the obstacle should be overcome with determination or avoided as a severe danger.

The priests, in the before-mentioned passage, went into the Jordan River. Joshua later recorded, "And it shall come to pass, as soon as the soles of the feet of the priests that bear the ark of the LORD, the Lord of all the earth, shall rest in the waters of Jordan, that the waters of Jordan shall be cut off from the waters that come down from above; and they shall stand upon an heap" (Joshua 3:13). God did not hold back the waters of the Jordan River until the priests' feet were in the water. After much prayer, if God gives you peace about a decision that is not sinful, go ahead and get your feet wet.

Let's Go Fishing

John Preached Jesus

John 3:22-26

God promised Israel a line of prophets which would be fulfilled in the great prophet, Jesus Christ (Duet. 18:18-22). John the Baptist was the last prophet of that line of prophets before the appearance of Jesus Christ. He is often referred to as the forerunner of Christ. God senr John to prepare a people for the Lord (Luke 1:17). Jesus Christ would come and take those people and form a New Testament Church (the Bride, verse 29).

John completed his work of preparing a people and turned those people over to Jesus, John 1:35-39. John, for a short time, continued his ministry while Jesus began his ministry (John 3:22-24). During this short period of time, John continued to point people to Jesus, and identify Him as the Messiah whom men should follow.

Certain disciples and Jews came to John and questioned the authenticity of Jesus (John3:25,26). The sermon of John was in response to this question. His message was the longest dissertation by John ever recorded. He proclaimed many great truths in a few words. He preached Jesus Christ. This article explores nine divisions of the sermon of John. As in the days of John, these nine truths are often questioned by those who question the Biblical teachings about Christ, such as, His deity. John valiantly proclaimed the truths of Christ.

The Authority of Christ (3:27). John rightly declared the authority of Jesus Christ. As God had given John a witness of the Savior, the Heavenly Father had sent His only begotten Son with heavenly authority, (John 20:21; Matt. 28:18).

The Superiority of Christ (3:28). John readily admitted that he was not the Christ, but he knew Who was the Christ, and that Jesus was superior to him. Jesus Christ is superior to man, angels and all creation. He is eternally the Second Person of the Divine Trinity.

The Relationship of Christ (3:29). Jesus Christ, according to the sermon of John, was the Divine Bridegroom. The New Testament church is the bride of Jesus Christ. Although John announced the bride relationship with Christ, he excluded himself from the bride relationship with Christ. John was a prophet and belonged to the Old Testament dispensation as to his position. He was never a member of the New Testament church that Jesus began. He was, as he proclaimed, "the friend of the bridegroom." His relationship with Christ and the relationship Christ had with His bride brought joy to the heart of this great prophet. He said, "this my joy therefore is fulfilled." John was a man who was satisfied and felt his life fulfilled just being what God wanted him to be and doing only what God wanted him to do, "prepare a people for the Lord."

The Work of Christ (3:30). John realized that his work was temporary, while the work of Christ was eternal. He said, "He must increase, but I must decrease." John woould soon die, but he would die in hope of the resurrection, a hope based on the work of Christ (Matt. 14; John 11:25).

The Preeminence of Christ (3:31). John declared the preeminence of Christ. He declared Christ to be "above all." He explained that that which was earthly could not be preeminent over that which was heavenly, rather, He that was of heavenly origin was above all. Paul later wrote, "Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:9-11).

The Testimony of Christ (3:32, 33). Jesus came from heaven with a testimony given to Him by the Father (John 5:30-39). He is the Faithful Witness of God (Rev. 1:5). Jesus testifies of truth to man. He is God's revelation of truth in human form (John 1:4). As men receive the testimony of Christ, they become a living seal or testimomy to the truth.

The Fullness of Christ (3:34). The Holy Spirit is a Divine Person and cannot be measured out like fluid. He is whole at all times and in all places that He dwells. The Holy Spirit conceived in Mary the Lord Jesus. The Holy Spirit sustained Him. The Holy Spirit resurrected Him. Christ did not have the presence of the Holy Spirit in measure or in part, but the Person of the Holy Spirit, even as the whole of the Godhead, dwelt in Christ complete and full. Paul wrote, "For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the God head bodily" (Col. 2:9).

The Sovereignty of Christ (3:35). The Father has promised the Son that He would place all enemies under His feet and that He would be declared among the creation as the Kings of Kings and Lord of Lords (Psa 110:1; Phil. 2; Rev. 19:16). Jesus, because of His victory over sin, death, and the grave, holds the keys to hell and death (Rev. 1:18). John declared that the Father has given all things into the hand of the Son. Jesus Christ will judge all things.

The Power of Christ (3:36). The power of Christ is most experienced in ways that it relates to salvation. John affirmed that salvation was through believing in Christ. Eternal life, he explained, came only to "He that believeth on the Son." Paul declared, "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

Although we do not possess many writings and sermons of John, in this one discourse, John preached the truths of Jesus as well as any one could. Thank you John for a fine message. A message for which he would give his life.

Looking Unto Jesus:

Trust and Obey

There is an old hymn which reads, "trust and obey, for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey." There's an amazing biblical truth found in these lyrics. Many saved people today are searching for happiness outside of obedience to Christ. It will not be found! Happiness will only be found when we submit to Christ. How do we submit? Simply trust and obey Him. Remember this truth, partial obedience to God is total disobedience. Let's notice some biblical examples of those who learned this lesson.

First, would you consider yourself to be obedient to God? Obedient means, "Submissive to authority, yielding to commands or performing what is required." Our ultimate example is Jesus. God is our father. He has a set of standards, requirements, and commands which we must submit to if we want His blessings, forgiveness, eternal life, revival, etc. We wonder why lives, homes, marriages, and country is falling apart. Often, it is due to disobedience.

One biblical example is Adam and Eve. We find the story in Genesis 3:1-7. God told them that they could eat of any tree save the one. What did they have to do to continue enjoying peace, perfection and happiness, Trust and Obey God? It's a simple task, however, their disobedience led to the fall of mankind into sin. Notice, eating fruit isn't a bad thing. God told them not to eat of this specific fruit tree and they did eat. That's disobedience. There is no happiness for God's Children in a disobedient life.

Another biblical example is Cain and Abel. We find the story in Genesis 4:1-7. God wanted a sacrifice so they brought sacrifices. There's nothing wrong with bringing a sacrifice. It's what God wanted from them. However, God wanted blood to be shed, and instead, Cain brought the fruits of his hands. Partial obedience is total disobedience. We cannot please God by disobeying Him and trying to impress Him on our terms. In turn, we will find no happiness by partially trusting and obeying.

A final example is Samuel and Saul. We find the story in 1 Samuel 13:8-14. Saul made a sacrifice in thanksgiving to God after a battle won. However, this was not Saul's right. Samuel was to handle that. God had set a standard and Saul disregarded it. He did not obey. This led to him losing his right to sit on the throne. Disobedience always costs God's People.

Are you obedient? We often wonder why we are losing in life. Perhaps, it is due to our disobedience towards God. Maybe you are serving Him, but are you serving Him on his terms or on yours? Partial obedience is total disobedience.

Bible Truth is a Healthy Spiritual Diet

An old saying reminds us that we need to be as wise as cows – they spit out the weeds when they eat. The same is true with God's people concerning their spiritual diet. We need to have enough spiritual discernment to spit out the weeds of false teaching. When cows fail to spit out one particular weed, they get sick and their milk doesn't taste good. False doctrine shouldn't taste good to God's people. "Buy the truth, and sell it not; also wisdom, and instruction, and understanding" (Proverbs 23:23 KJV). When the weeds of false doctrine taste good to believers, they get spiritually sick from a bad diet.

A healthy congregation feeds on sound doctrine. "Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:31, 32 KJV). Those that do not continue in the truth will be bound by false teachings.

A healthy spiritual diet includes rest, exercise and good nutritional food. The believer must rest in Christ in order to continue to grow spiritually. "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30 KJV). The right exercise for a believer is walking with Jesus, worshipping in the truth and studying His Word. "And they said one to another, Did not our heart burn within us, while he talked with us by the way, and while he opened to us the scriptures?" (Luke 24:32 KJV). Bible truth is the only nutritional food for believers.

There is a lot of junk food that is presented in the form of preaching and teaching. Those that choose spiritual junk food for their diet will continue to be "Ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth" (2 Timothy 3:7 KJV). Sound doctrine is so wholesome that children of God experience spiritual growth as they digest and ponder the Word of God. Some spiritual fast food involves skipping true Bible study and relying on men's ideas.

If the Bible does not teach it as the truth, the idea presented is unscriptural. You can build a very popular and entertaining speech on an unscriptural concept. At our church, we baptize those new believers who have just been saved before we accept them as church members according to the vote of the church. I've seen dogs and cats baptized by kids playing church, but never a chicken. Zach baptizes his chicken.

Most preachers love chicken. Good old fried chicken does wonderful things for me that junk food cannot do. Have you considered your spiritual diet lately? Are you taking in a lot of "he said" and "she said" instead of "Thus saith the Lord?" Ask yourself, "What saith the scripture?" You will be fed and filled with God's truth. Try it, you'll like it.
