By the Dean:

The Earnest of the Spirit

Now he that hath wrought us for the selfsame thing is God, who also hath given unto us the earnest of the Spirit, 2 Corinthians 5:5.

The word earnest was translated from the Greek word avrrabw/na (arrhabona). The Friberg Lexicon defines the word as "transliterated from the Hebrew; literally, as a legal and commercial technical term, an advance transaction that guarantees the validity of a contract or a full purchase price down payment, first installment, pledge". The practice of supplying earnest money is still common today. Real estate contracts still use both the term and practice of earnest money. A real estate website describes earnest money as "deposit made to a seller showing the buyer's good faith in a transaction. Often used in real estate transactions, earnest money allows the buyer additional time when seeking financing".

The earnest that God has provided to the believer, as evidence of the validity of His future intent, is the Holy Spirit. When a person acknowledges their need for Jesus and cries out for salvation, they are born again by the Spirit (John 3:1-6). The Holy Spirit indwells and seals the eternal spirit of the believer. The spirit of a person that has been sealed by the Holy Spirit is cleansed from and eternally protected from sin (1 John 5:18). This is the foundation and support of "eternal security of the believer". Once a person has been saved it is impossible for him to ever be lost again. The Spirit seals the believer. Paul wrote, "Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts" (2 Corinthians 1:22). To the Ephesians he wrote "In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that Holy Spirit of promise" (Ephesians 1:13) and "grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption" (Ephesians 4:30).

Since God has "given unto us the earnest of the Spirit" then legally He has not completed His obligation. A day of redemption awaits the believer. Noah Webster's 1828 Dictionary defines redemption as "the repurchase of captured goods or prisoners; the act of procuring the deliverance of persons or things from the possession and power of captors by the payment of an equivalent; ransom". Paul wrote, "But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members. O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?" (Romans 7:23-24).

It is a wonderful thing to be sealed by the Holy Spirit. Possessing God's salvation, which cannot be lost, is priceless, but the believer has even more to look forward to. Currently, the believer only has the earnest. But one day Jesus will return to redeem that which He has already claimed. "What a day that will be when my Jesus I shall see. When I look upon His face, the one who saved me by His grace".

848 Professions and 70 Baptisms

With great joy I write this month stating that I am getting settled into my new role. The learning curve is shrinking and the new information is not quite as overwhelming as it was this time last month. With your prayers and God's grace next month will be even better.

News: Gena and I were privileged to make stops, on behalf of ABA Missions, in Arkansas, Florida, Alabama and Louisiana during the month of July. We enjoyed visiting the brethren and familiarizing ourselves with their ministries.

Names: While in Fayetteville, AR, we visited with Arkansas State Missionary Jeremy Flanagan. In Florida we briefly talked with several missionaries but enjoyed most of one day with Interstate Missionary Brett Bell and his wife, Amanda, in Sarasota. Hurricane Barry altered our plans to go to Louisiana so we landed in Haleyville, AL, where we enjoyed a great Sunday with Interstate Missionary Allen Barton and his family. Eventually we found our way back below I-10 where we spent a weekend with Interstate Missionary Jason Hebert and his family along with Missionary Helper Jared Conatser and his wife, Sidney. The last Sunday was spent back in Pine Bluff visiting with Pastor Victor McGehee and the fine folks at Canaan MBC who co-sponsor two Filipino National Missionaries, Eddie Abaja and Christopher Llego.

Numbers: For the month of July 2019 ABA Missionaries around the world reported 848 professions of faith and 70 baptisms. Added to June's totals of 648 and 40 (respectively) we are praising the Lord for 1496 Professions of faith and 110 baptisms in the last two months. *To God be the glory, great things He hath done!*

Needs: Though the calendar changes pages the needs of the missionaries remain constant and consistent. The purpose of this office is primarily two-fold: to further the Gospel of Jesus into all the world and to help sister churches help their missionaries. 

Looking Unto Jesus:

A Precious Promise from God

Besides John 3:16, Romans 8:28 may be the most beloved and claimed promise of the New Testament. Life is full of trials and troubles. It is good to know that for God's people everything is being worked out according to the plan of a great God. This is a hard promise to accept, yet if we can accept it, life's struggles will become more bearable.

Notice **The Confidence of the Promise**. Paul's statement is a shocking statement, but it is one that is absolutely true nonetheless! This is the ironclad promise of God! His reputation rides on this verse being true! He did not say that all things are good, but that they will work for our good. It is a promise that is as good as the God Who made it! We can be as confident of this promise as we are in God according to Titus 1:2.

Next, we see **The Completeness of the Promise**. Notice what Paul didn't say. He didn't say "most" or "some", but "ALL." God is working in all the times of His people's lives. He's working during the sweet times when all is good. He's working during the sorrowful times when all is bad. He's working during the times when Satan is tearing us down. He's even working during the sinful times when we walk away from Him. God uses all the circumstances of life for our good. We may not see the good right now, but we can still take comfort and rejoice in the completeness of God's promise.

We also see **The Condition of the Promise**. This promise is not for everyone! It's only to those who love God. It's for those who are called according to His purpose. If all things work together for good to the lover of God, the opposite must be true for those who do not love him! Many of God's promises are this way. They speak to or apply to people based on their love for God. Do you love God? Are you saved? Are you obedient to Him? Those two things are necessities if we love God.

Last, we see **The Consequence of the Promise**. This is not a verse designed for your happiness. It is not to be taken lightly. This verse cannot be divorced from the verses that immediately follow it. In Romans 8:29-30, notice God's purpose in turning everything to good is not to bless you, make you happy, or make you wealthy. God is doing all that He does to make you more like Jesus! God didn't finish with you at salvation. He will continue to shape you until you reflect His image perfectly. God is busy reproducing Himself in each of us. That's why God is working things for our good.

Associations of Churches

2 Corinthians 8:1-15

I. The Meaning of Associations.

- A. A Joint Fellowship, as brethren. While churches are independent bodies of the Lord, saved and baptized members are brethren as believers and as church members.
- B. A Common Fellowship, in doctrine and purpose. The doctrine is the "faith once delivered unto the saints" (Jude 3), and Jesus taught the purpose in Matthew 28:19, 20.
- C. An Equal Fellowship, of independent Churches. Nobody but Jesus is to Lord over a church (Eph. 5:23-25). While churches maintain their own autonomy and authority from the Lord, they may willingly work together for the cause of Christ.

II. The History of Associations.

A. New Testament Times.

Acts 15:41 – Paul and Silas traveled among the churches confirming their faith and doctrine.

2 Cor. 8:4, 5 – Macedonian churches labored together to support Paul.

Phil. 4:10, 14 – The Church at Philippi supported Paul, though he was not a member there.

Rom. 15:25-27 – Paul encouraged the church at Rome to give. 2 Cor. 8:23 – Paul referred to brethren as "messengers of the churches"

1 Cor. 16:1-4 – Paul mentioned the churches working together to produce an offering for Jerusalem, and a messenger to deliver the offering.

Rev. 22:16 – Jesus spoke of churches as being associated as a group.

- B. Post New Testament Times. From the second century AD until American history, independent churches associated together so that they are known in history by group names: Montanists, Novations, Donatists, Paulicians, Albigenses, Waldenses, Ana-Baptists, and Baptists.
- C. Local associations of churches in America existed from the earliest days until modern times, beginning with the Philadelphia Association, AD 1707. The first national association was the Baptist General Association in 1905, which became the American Baptist Association in 1924.

III. The Advantages of Associations.

- A. The fellowship of churches is beneficial to the spiritual health & growth of the members.
- B. It can help promote doctrinal unity & soundness among the churches.
 - C. It can make difficult mission efforts more possible.

Summary: God has chosen to work through men and His churches to accomplish His work, and He has used and blessed associations of churches for His glory.
