Bible Conference: Evangelism

On March 13-14, 2023, LMBIS hosted the annual Bible Conference. The focus this year was Evangelism, both personal and corporate through the local churches. The guest speakers challenged the students, faculty, and guests in preaching the gospel.

Bro. Doug Gregg, pastor of Calvary MBC of Minden, started the conference on Monday with the topic of “Evangelism by the Church.” He shared how organized outreach through the church can be beneficial in getting church members to share the gospel. Bro. Tim Herrington, pastor of Central MBC of Pineville, spoke on “Evangelism in an Ungodly Culture,” teaching God’s view of immorality and the difficulty of preaching the gospel in a fallen world. Bro. Jason Hebert of Acadiana BC in Lafayette finished the first day’s session with “Evangelizing from the Pulpit.” Bro. Hebert shared the necessity of preaching sermons focused on evangelism.



On Tuesday, Bro. Trevor McCleskey, the pastor of Emmanuel MBC of Shreveport, shared the importance of “Evangelizing the Stranger.” Bro. McCleskey instructed us in sharing the gospel with people who are unfamiliar to us. Next was Bro. Mike Raines of Landmark MBC of Waco, Texas spoke to “Evangelizing in Challenging Situations.” Bro. Raines shared his experience as a chaplain in the military. Bro. Jason Hebert finished the day addressing the topic of “Evangelism to Religious People.”



God Blesses LMBIS Through His Churches



From the President

Thank You for the Pieces of Your Heart

While pastoring my first church, I also worked a full-time secular job. As the church's finances became healthier, the church voted to give me a raise. Not needing the money, I graciously encouraged the church not to do it. This happened twice. After the second time, I talked to Bro. Don McCormick about the situation. I remember telling him that I felt badly about telling the church no, but I didn't need the money. Bro. Don quickly reminded me why he used to lovingly call us young men in the ministry "dumb, dumb preachers." He let me know that I was hurting two people by refusing the raise.

First, I was robbing the church of a blessing. Acts 20:35 reminds everyone that Jesus taught that it was more blessed to give than to receive. God was trying to bless them through their giving to me, and I was refusing it.

Secondly, I was hurting the next pastor. Even though I did not need the money at the moment it was being offered, I was impacting the heart of the church. If I continually refused the church's offering of a raise, eventually they would quit offering. Then, eventually, they would even quit thinking about it. The next pastor may not be in a financial position like mine. He may be living paycheck to paycheck, and a raise from the church might greatly help his family. If the church doesn't think any more about a raise for preacher because the dumb previous pastor wouldn't ever accept it, then the current preacher and his family will be in want.

I was raised in a different era and in a different way. My parents always taught me to earn it if I wanted it. I was taught to be charitable, but never a charity case. Right or wrong, I have always prided myself on being a giver, not a receiver...until recently.

On December 19, 2021, my son Hunter, his beautiful wife Lexi, and their two-month old baby Jett, were heading to church when they were in a wreck. My grandson Jett was the only survivor.

Almost immediately, money started pouring in. I was very confused and frustrated, almost angry. Neither we, nor Lexi's family needed any financial assistance to pay for the funeral. Nor were we going to need any financial assistance to ensure that Jett's needs were always met. But the money kept coming. Hundreds, thousands, tens of thousands of dollars from all over the country, some even from other countries. Why? Why were people sending our families all of this money?

Thanks to my Lord, I remembered a Scripture. Matthew wrote, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matthew 6:21) Every dollar sent to our family was a piece of somebody's heart.

As I consider the generosity of the Lord's people and His churches in their support of LMBIS, I am reminded that each dollar sent, is a piece of a heart. You send your dollars here because your hearts are here. We are thankful for your love and pray that God blesses you for your generosity.

VBS Still Needed

Covid changed many things, but Vacation Bible School in the Summertime is still one of the greatest community outreaches a church can have. With the challenges that churches must face in modern times, the way that churches do things have had to change with the circumstances, and so it is that VBS has taken on different forms. Some churches still have the traditional five day or five night VBS and that is wonderful. However, other churches have gone to using the VBS materials in other ways.

Sunday through Wednesday: Some may begin on Sunday morning with a VBS program that takes the place of Sunday School and extends through Wednesday night.

Five Sunday Nights: It works well to have VBS for 5 Sunday nights in a row, for example, a church observed during five Sunday nights in July, "Five Nights with Jesus." This allows churches more workers being available and works easier for those who work during the week. Be careful, however, because the kids and parents may get used to coming on Sunday nights and ask for more after VBS has ended. Getting folks used to coming to your church on Sunday evening won't be a bad problem.

Five Wednesday Nights: Like the Five Sunday nights is the Five Wednesday night program, which might work better for some churches.

Don't Forget the Adults: While planning a special VBS for the children, any church can plan a VBS class for the Adults who are not directly involved with the youth VBS. Bogard Press has literature for both the children and adults. Both will be blessed by a VBS study of the Scriptures. www.bogardpress.org

"Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen" (Matthew 28:20).

When it comes to Christian education, we are often tempted to believe that what we say holds the greatest influence when it comes to spiritual transformation in the lives of others. Of course, our words are very important, and we who instruct others in the Word should be cautious regarding the soundness of our teaching (James 3:1). But when it comes to making a lasting impact for the sanctification of others, our godly example extends far beyond the words we speak.

Each church's mission of making disciples of all nations includes the requirement of instructing believers "to observe all things" Christ commanded. Notice Jesus did not command His church to simply teach "all things" but to guide disciples to "observe all things." Successful completion of the Great Commission for a church occurs when people are saved, baptized, instructed and are actively practicing Christian disciplines. This requires more than mere words from a lecturer.

Christian education falls short of spiritual transformation when it includes biblical instruction but not biblical practice. We cannot only tell people what to do in obedience to Christ; we must also show them. This

is why Paul told Timothy to "set an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity" (1 Timothy 4:12). Paul assumed a continual, collective interchange of influence amongst Timothy and the church members he pastored. Timothy's influence would include his words of instruction, but also his conversations, acts of love, demonstrations of faith and outward commitment to holiness. Timothy was to lead by example.

Many churches have proven to be quite successful at providing opportunities for instruction. Are we providing environments that foster ongoing interaction amongst God's people, so members may be influenced by one another as they "observe all things" Christ has commanded? How well are we leading by example?

For the month of February, the ABA recommended missionaries reported 441 professions of faith and 27 baptisms, bringing our totals for the year to 4,517 professions of faith and 458 baptisms! Praise the Lord! I do ask that if you know of any church organizations since last June, please let us know by email.

Sadly, many churches are trying to blend in with the world, hoping that will draw in unbelievers. Song services look more like rock concerts. Sermons sound more like pep talks. Youth programs might as well be sports programs. We've forgotten that God has called us to be different, to be sanctified, to be set apart. Like Calvinists, we can easily substitute the wisdom of men above the Word of God by trusting in our own ideas to win lost souls rather than just doing what the Bible says.

We've believed the devil's lie that going door to door and preaching the gospel doesn't work anymore. Yet that's what the disciples did. That's the example Christ set for us. That's what we are commanded to do! Yet, we act like Calvinists, as if God is going to do all the work. God has called us to be ambassadors for Him and preach the gospel to the world on His behalf! The Bible says that God has chosen the foolishness of PREACHING to save them that believe.

How beautiful are the FEET of them that preach the gospel! Lost souls are not going to seek God. We must seek them! We must go out to find them, to preach the gospel to them so that they may hear, and believe, and call upon the name of the Lord (Romans 10:13-15).
