Calvary Baptist Church hosted the commencement ceremonies for LMBIS on Friday, April 28, 2023. Before the services, Calvary hosted a reception for students, their families, and alumni in the reception hall. Following a welcome by Bro. Doug Gregg, pastor and Bro. Mike Wilkes, president, and a time of worship through song, Bro. Jim Crain delivered the evening's message from Acts 27 on "I Believe God" to one of the largest attended graduations in several years.

Fundamentals of Music

ABA Secretary-Treasurer of Missions

It has been another blessed month at the mission's office. Things have been very busy going through missionary recommendation forms and preparing for the upcoming Standing Missionary Committee meeting and the ABA Messengers Meeting in Spokane. We are currently working with the auditors to make sure things are in order. In addition to that, I had the privilege to represent and report on ABA missions at the California state meeting. It was a great time of preaching, reports and fellowship.

We received 144 Missionary Recommendation Forms for the 2023-2024 associational year. Out of that number, 22 are newly recommended. Please be in prayer for these missionaries, missionary helpers, and mission ministries.

For the month of April, the missionaries recommended through the mission's office reported 449 professions of faith and 134 baptisms. This brings totals for this associational year to 5,350 professions of faith and 631 baptisms. Praise the Lord!

The Standing Missionary Committee will meet at Northern Hills Baptist Church on Monday, May 22nd, beginning at 1 PM, and again on Tuesday morning at about 8:30 AM. If you are interested in missionaries and what God is doing where they are serving, we would love for you to come be with us. I hope that you have made plans to be at the ABA messenger meeting in Spokane. There will be many important items of business discussed and voted on. The last day to book a room in our block is Friday, May 19, 2023.

At a recent meeting, I was reflecting on the correlation between missions and our publications ministry. Our missionaries are working hard to reach families with the gospel and to establish local New Testament churches. Our literature is designed to assist churches and missionaries in educating members and guests with the truths of God's Word. In both ministries, the spreading of the gospel of Jesus Christ is the ultimate goal. Through the work of our missionaries and the printed page lives are being changed and churches and missions are strengthened.

Our missionaries continue to work spreading the gospel. Acadiana Baptist Church in Lafayette continues to pay down on their property. Since last November churches in Louisiana have contributed over \$10,000.00 toward our state project. I expect that in the next few months, there will be some exciting news coming from Lafayette!



The Importance of Christian Community by Cameron Hayes

I believe one of the most important aspects of the saved individual's life is community. Community among believers or others who think and believe the same way can be found in many different settings such as church, school, or even outside these places. Community is described as a feeling of fellowship with other people.

I remember feeling this sense of fellowship growing up at my church. This was a place I could go and gather with other people my age and experience the love and compassion of the Lord. Because of this, my mind and heart were opened to the Word. A phrase I always heard growing up was: "God has a way of opening doors and closing others." God has a way of using the most unlikely people to reach others.

I have been blessed to be able to attend the First Priority group at Minden High School as well as other Christian student groups at other local schools in the area. One of the first things I noticed among these groups is a sense of community and love. Every week, students gather to fellowship with one another, and to love one another amid all the challenges they face today. I see students talking with students that they would never even think of talking to on a normal basis. God can take the lowliest of people and use them in the mightiest ways.

I think of the apostle Paul whom I would have considered to be the furthest person from preaching God's Word. Before he was renamed Paul, he was known as Saul who persecuted Christians and was not concerned at all with kingdom work. Yet in spite of his past, God used Paul in such a mighty way to reach countless souls for the Lord.

Usually when I am surrounded by other believers, I find myself really absorbing those moments. The importance of Christian community cannot be understated. These are the times when we can reach others for the Lord and make an impact on someone else's life. Also on the flip side, this is the time when others can impact us. In the past eleven months as the youth director at Calvary Baptist Church, I have been blessed to teach and preach God's Word, but also, I have been blessed to have grown closer to the Lord. I have learned from others, and God has used them to



do an amazing work in my life. Christian community is both a blessing and a tool that can be used not only to reach others but also to tell them about the Lord.

Studying the Bible by Me Greege

Taking time to study God's Word is something everyone of us should do daily! Diligently studying the Bible can take time and work as you see what works for you as you try to remember what you have read about and learned. Some great study habits include memorizing it, reading, or listening to the Bible intently, and taking notes about what you've read.

How do you find what works for you? It depends on the type of learner you are. There are 4 main styles of learning, and these are visual, auditory, reading/writing, and kinesthetic. If you are visual, you probably enjoy looking at pictures and graphs with informative videos, too, to help you learn. As an auditory learner, you like to listen to somebody speak or lecture about the topic you are learning about. For people who are reading/writing learners, you would appreciate reading texts or writing notes to learn. A kinesthetic learner likes to do hands-on projects and move around while learning. I suggest finding out what type of learner you are because after you do, you can know what helps you learn about the Bible.

Memorized verses come in handy when you profess your faith to someone! To memorize a verse try using the four styles of learning. Visual learners may want to doodle the verse or see the verse in a picture, while auditory learners may say it out loud. However, reading/ writing learners could write the verse or read it, and kinesthetic learners may create a dance or hand motions to memorize it. I implore you to memorize verses no matter what type of learner you are!

To study the Word, you must read or listen to it! As a kinesthetic learner walks around a room as they read or listen to the Bible, a reading/writing learner would most likely sit down and read the Bible. While an auditory learner can listen to it, visual learners may picture what's happening in their mind. Use these thoughts to read or listen to the Bible.

As you study God's Word, you may want to take notes! Visual learners may doodle their notes as a kinesthetic learner may imagine themself in the situation and then write about it. Reading/writing learners, however, could possibly easily take notes because they like to write. Auditory learners may not need to write down the notes because it could be memorized already.

Studying the Word of God is important to do as a Christian. No matter the style you prefer, I implore you to study His Word!
