The pantry at the seminary serves as a great supplement to the needs of students and their families. For decades, churches and individuals have been gracious to our students by sharing the blessings that God has given them. From fresh produce and frozen meat, to canned goods and other non-perishable items, the Lord's people have blessed every generation that has come through LMBIS.

The pantry is an integral part of seminary life. The men who answer the call to preach, drop their nets, leaving jobs and sometimes homes, and come to seminary seeking to become equipped for the ministry. They move themselves and, if God has given them a family, their wives, and children by faith to follow the Lord. All our students are currently employed either secularly or ministerially, or both, to support themselves while attending seminary.



With many more students living on campus this year and a large increase in married students with families, the pantry needs have grown. As a result, our pantry stock has decreased substantially within the first couple of weeks of school. Please consider taking a special collection for our pantry.

The Lord's churches have always been good at meeting needs, and we have no doubts that the Lord will provide yet again. Please prayerfully consider this need in your church.

FALL SEMESTER BEGINS

The fall semester of the 2023-2024 school year of LMBIS began with Homecoming services on Monday, July 31, 2023, at Calvary Baptist Church in Minden, Louisiana. President Mike Wilkes welcomed returning



and new students along with their families and guests. Bro. "Scooter" Kelley, pastor of Oak Flat MBC in Huntington, Texas, brought the morning's message from 1 Peter 1:3-8 on "All My Hope Is in Jesus."

Following lunch provided by Calvary Baptist Church, an organizational meeting of the LMBIS Alumni and Friends Association met at the seminary chapel. Bro. Monroe Mercer, pastor of Green Acres BC of Bossier City, Louisiana, was elected to serve as the president. The purpose of this new association is to inform and encourage supporters of the seminary. The goal is to raise awareness of the needs and promote the seminary to prospective students.

The seminary is blessed to have nineteen students enrolled for on-campus classes. The new online courses have twenty-six enrolled taking Homiletics and Lesson Preparation, Christian Doctrine, and Fundamentals of Music. On-campus classes will be every Monday and Tuesday from now until November 14, 2023, (except for Labor Day) from 8:00 a.m. until 3:10 p.m. Our campus and building are open during this time, and we welcome guests at any time to sit in on classes. Paul wrote of the need for someone to preach, tell, or witness of the saving grace of our Lord to the unsaved of humanity, "How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? and how shall they preach, except they be sent" (Romans 10:14-15)? The gospel is in the Word and as churches send preachers to preach the gospel, so the churches of the American Baptist Association have sent the BSSC to publish the gospel to the world. The work of Bogard Press plays an important role in the process that ultimately gets the Word out to the world. It may be considered a big role or a small role, but we see it as an all-important role. Pray for us as we do our part in this great ministry of the Lord.

The first 6 months of 2023 have been tallied and the results are good. The cash balance in the ministry account is holding steady. This is an improvement over the 2022 movement which showed a large loss. The rise in literature prices will not take effect until this Fall, so it is a good sign that the cash flow is good.

Also, a comparison between the first 6 months of 2022 and 2023 reveals an increase in sales. The internet and phone sales increased a total of \$129,458.73 these first 6 months over the same period in 2022. The

retail store sales have shown an increase of \$22,634.15 over last year's first two quarters, which again, is very positive. To summarize, both the cash flow and sales are good and steady. This is certainly encouraging to us when considering the last three years under the Covid influence.

The rain finally stopped long enough for us to finish some needed repairs on our Parking lot. The rear area was sinking, and water was pooling badly. The repairs went well, and the lot is now in good shape. The photo shows the repaired area with recent rainwater running down the drain valley as it should.

I was privileged to preach at Calvary MBC, Magnolia, Arkansas, First BC of Delight, Arkansas, and will soon preach at First Columbia Association meeting in South Arkansas. I deeply appreciate opportunities to preach the Word and be used among the churches. Our VBS for 2024 is entitled Shine! In Shine! VBS we will be looking at the redemption story of Jesus through the lens of five different Bible stories. Shine! VBS should be an immersive experience for students in which they "go to the movies" to see stories that depict the gospel. Other elements could include concession/popcorn stands, movie critics, ushers, stars, lights, cameras or even creating your own movie to show at the end of the week.

Students will solve the mystery of who knocked over the statue of Dagon, they will observe God's love in the romance story of Ruth and Boaz, they will see the foolishness of sin in the comedic episode of Balaam and his donkey, they will celebrate God's triumph in the action-packed account of David and Goliath, and they will learn to rejoice with

music when they observe David rejoicing before God as the ark of the covenant was brought into Jerusalem.

God's Word guides us to center our lives upon Jesus Christ and make much of Him. Everything we do in our ministry is aimed at bringing others into deepening relationships with Him. Our prayer is that Shine! VBS from Bogard Press will be a useful tool in leading others toward Christ.
