

President Michael Wilkes along with the faculty and staff of LMBIS recognized and honored students for their accomplishments on Friday, May 3, 2024, at Calvary Baptist Church in Minden, Louisiana. With a crowd of 233 in attendance, family and friends of the graduates witnessed 28 students receive certificates, Bro. Keith Rose bringing the diplomas, and degrees for their hard work through on-campus

classes as well as online classes. Following special music, Bro. Keith Rose, pastor of Egypt MBC of Hamburg, Arkansas, brought the evening's message from Leviticus 16 on "The Fit Man."

Bro. Micah Carter, Dean of Online Studies, began the presentation by announcing the names of the students who completed at least one semester of online classes for credit. Bro. Nathan Luellen, Dean of Students, then announced the list of on-campus graduates, with six receiving their certificate of merit, eight receiving their diploma, and seven receiving degrees. Those receiving the Associate Degree in Ministerial Studies were Phillip Baker, Jason Carlisle, Johnathon Ezernack, and Jacob Schumacher (pictures on page 6). Three students also received the following degrees: Master of English Bible, Jeremy Bowers; Master of Theology, Joseph Pemberton; and Doctor of Theology, Keith Rose.

Scholarships were also awarded to eleven students for the 2024-2025 school year. These scholarships are memorial scholarships set up by families of loved ones who have been associated with LMBIS. The announcement of these scholarships is a reminder of the impact and influence of those who served before us.

From the President The Great Physician

While recently perusing social media, I read a post by a preacher brother. He had written about some of the challenges faced in witnessing in our current culture. In his post, the preacher wrote about how regular it has become that people do not see themselves as sinners before a holy God. But, on the contrary, how often it is that people reckon themselves to be at their worst, acceptable to God, but at their best, praiseworthy.

I absolutely agree with my brother's findings, but we should not be surprised by the current climate in our culture. For several years, we have watched a noticeable decline of any biblically based truths being socially accepted as absolutes. Instead, the Bible is deemed irrelevant as a standard, church attendance is viewed as a pastime, and holy living is considered antiquated. Obviously, the Lord's churches are not as influential in American culture as they once were.

While this is disheartening, I want to encourage the Lord's people to refrain from promoting the doomsday dialogue. God's people have always ministered to a sinful people in the midst of a sinful world. In some places of the world, the Lord's people live in daily fear for their lives because of their identity in Christ. However, for our entire lifetimes, we Americans have enjoyed something like a home-field advantage, but it is looking like we may have to finish out our series playing on the road. But so did many of our forefathers, yet Paul wrote, "Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us" (Romans 8:37).

God's footstool has not been wobbled, His hand has not been shortened, our duties have not changed. We are in the midst of a war. Everyone has been damaged. The battlefield is littered with mortally wounded victims. Each of them is in desperate need of healing.

These sin wounded people are clinging to the last bit of air in their lungs, but at the same time demanding that the medics leave them alone. When being accused of tending to the sin damaged people of His day, Jesus said, "They that are whole have no need of the physician, but they that are sick: I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance" (Mark 2:17).

The problem is that these victims are often willingly unaware of their condition. Paul wrote, "As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one: There is none that understandeth, there is none that seeketh after God. They are all gone out of the way, they are together become unprofitable; there is none that doeth good, no, not one" (Romans 3:10-12).

The wounds of sin are eternally fatal. But helping people who feel fine to understand their crucially corrupted and condemned condition can be quite challenging. What can we do? Preach the Word! Don't minimize sin. Don't maximize morality. Your family, friends, neighbors, and coworkers all need to know that God has diagnosed them. Their wounds of sin have corrupted their condition. They are in serious trouble. They're not going to make it-unless they call on the Great Physician.

Have you ever thought or heard that seminary is a school only for preachers and pastors? Yes, it is true that both commonly attend seminary. However, seminary is a school for anyone who desires to increase their knowledge of God's Word. Is that you? God's People should make every effort to always further their biblical education. In 2 Timothy 2:15 Paul told Timothy, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

This charge to Timothy should be received and applied in the life of each Child of God. We should study. That word means to endeavor diligently. It also means to hasten or to exert one's self. How much effort do you put forth in studying the Word of God? Each day is an opportunity to learn more about God's Word. Let us be diligent in our study habits.

The student nor the teacher can properly teach something they don't know. The student nor the teacher can know something they don't study. Studying, learning, understanding, and sharing God's Word is a process that is worth embarking on with haste. The last thing the world needs is Bible students wrongly dividing God's Word. One of the greatest needs the world has is Bible students who will diligently study the Word and rightly divide it to all mankind.

The world of biblical education has progressed tremendously. This is true at LMBIS. The seminary is now offering online Bible classes. We just concluded our first year of online studies and have received much positive feedback. We are looking forward to equipping more Bible students in the Fall semester. That includes you. Seminary is attended by preacher and pastors, but it is not restricted to them. Our world and our churches need solid Bible teachers in the classrooms, homes, and pews. You are both encouraged and invited to join our online studies option of learning. Our online instructors are proven men from around the country who have faithfully served and studied for many years. They have composed their content to guide you in your study efforts.

It doesn't get any more convenient than learning in the comfort of your own home on a schedule that works for you.

We will be purchasing a new 45" Polar paper cutter to replace our old one that has not been working very well. This is a top brand cutter from the well-known Heidelberg company. We are thankful we had enough funds to pay for it from our equipment fund. Also, the committee approved the purchase of a new 15-Ton Air Conditioner to replace an old failed unit in the warehouse. Last year, the heat in the warehouse was rough with not all the units working, but this year, this new unit will make a big difference. Also, we will be doing some facelift remodeling on the bathrooms and the store front. God has provided the finances for these processes for which we are thankful.

During the committee meeting, our auditor reported that we finished the 2023 year with a good profit, and we thank God first and foremost. The finances, which have been difficult since the Covid experience, have been improving and the ministry should have another good year in 2024. As we should know, God is faithful and good. The employees also have been faithful and cooperative to help improve the health of the ministry. We have just transitioned to a 4-day work week, Monday through Thursday. It is estimated that being closed on Fridays will save the ministry approximately \$25,000 per year. Such a savings will be a big help. This does not involve the Bookstore which will remain open as usual Monday through Saturday.

In summary, the Lord continues to guide us and bless us, and all is well. Come visit anytime in Texarkana.

"This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success. 25) to the death of a revered leader (Deuteronomy 34), God's children knew what it was like to meet obstacles in their attempt to obey Him. So, when Joshua picked up the mantle of leadership from Moses, he knew success would only come through challenges. This is why God encouraged him to courageously dismiss his doubts and fears and to lean on the only formula for success Israel had ever known: faithful dependence upon God and obedience to His Word. Joshua would only lead Israel successfully over every obstacle that stood in front of them by trusting God and courageously doing what God said.

This formula has not changed over the course of time. Throughout the last two thousand years, no matter what obstacles God's enemies have thrown in front of them, churches have come to expect and enjoy success by the same encouragement: "This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth...and then thou shalt have good success...for the Lord thy God is with thee" (Joshua 1:8, 9). Whatever you are planning to help your church fulfill the Great Commission, do not be surprised when obstacles come, but plan for success by staying true to the Word of God and courageously, intentionally obeying all He has commanded. Certainly,

God is with those who humbly, obediently depend upon Him.

Greetings in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ. April was another month of travel for me and a busy time around the office with recommendation forms and the annual audit. Committeeman Wayne Stringer and I traveled to the Philippines on March 31st and returned home on April 12th. It was a tiring trip but very profitable. It was an honor and a privilege to meet so many men whose names I have seen for years. We had 3 domestic flights visiting three islands while there, preached two missions conferences at seminaries, and saw the meeting locations, and visited with the missionaries and some of their people at about 35 different locations. I preached a total of 7 times while there and was able to speak to the student body about ministry in Davao. On April 24, it was an honor to speak at the Acts 1:8 Conference at Landmark MBC in Mt. Enterprise, TX. My family and I enjoyed being with the good folks at New Liberty BC in Garland, TX on April 28.

For the month of April, the missionaries report 336 professions of faith and 66 baptisms. That brings our totals for this associational year to 4,507 professions of faith and 538 baptisms.

I hope you are planning to attend the 2024 Pre-Association Standing Missionary Committee Meeting. It will be held at Northern Hills BC in Texarkana, AR on May 20-21. The meeting will begin at 1 PM on Monday. The address is 6000 Sammy Lane. I am happy to report that we received 153 missionary recommendation forms to be considered this coming year. Of those, we have 15 new missionaries! Praise the Lord!

Lastly, if you have not done so, we ask that your church send in a church letter form and an offering to help with the expense of meeting. I look forward to seeing you all at the 98th Annual Messenger Assembly of the American Baptist Association June 18-20 in Springfield, IL. Praying for a great meeting!

We are consistently in the upper thirties and very soon should be running in the forties. Our praise team is leading us in worship and people are finding ways to serve! It's a very exciting time!

MISSIONARY TRAVELS April included some very exciting and encouraging opportunities. I was privileged to serve as the evangelist at White Oak Grove MBC in Hope, AR. This wonderful church family, led by Bro. John Nations, has a very sweet spirit and great love of missions. I don't know if I did them any good, but they sure did my heart well. Speaking of revival, I was also invited to El Dorado MBC (El Dorado, AR) to preach a Faith Promise Missions Conference. Faith Promise is such an exciting way to support missions and I was able to teach and preach about the how and why of it. I configured the system so that they can "Go Live" and play fullscreen "announcement" slides on a loop, both in the church and on the livestream, between Sunday School and the start of the worship service, and then during the worship service, the slides that are projected in the sanctuary are shown as a box in the upper right corner of the livestream. It really was a nice setup and I applaud pastor Williams and the congregation for their vision to use technology to make a positive first impression on potential first-time visitors who undoubtedly visit a church online before they ever visit in person.


